

Word Weave

Puzzle of the Month
October 15, 2006

Two halves of a quote are written on these horizontal and vertical strips of letters. In order to read the quote, you must alternate letters between the two grids as if the rows and columns are woven together like a tapestry. Arranging them one way (over, under, over, etc.) reveals half the quote; then, arranging the letters the opposite way (under, over, under, etc.) reveals the second half. (See Page 2 for an example)

Spaces between words are designated by either ends of a line, or by the black squares. If a word does not end on one line, it continues on the next line (or, possibly, on the next grid).

The letters highlighted in blue and yellow represent the first letters of the both halves of the quote. The letters in each strip are in order, but the strips themselves are not necessarily in order.

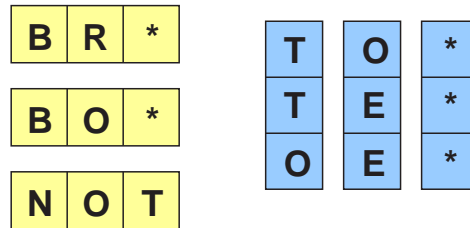

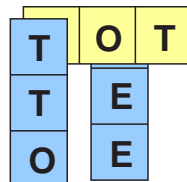

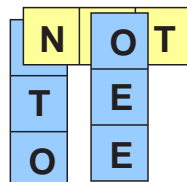
Start with the provided rows and columns of letters.



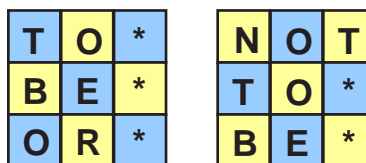
If you were to weave the strips over and under each other, like this...
